The following are the Regulations for admissions into **BAMS**, **BHMS & BUMS Courses** under Competent Authority Quota seats in Government Ayurveda, Homoeopathy & Unani Colleges and Competent Authority Seats in Private Un-aided Non-Minority Ayurveda and Homoeopathy Medical Colleges in the State of Andhra Pradesh for the academic year 2025-26.

1. NUMBER OF SEATS UNDER COMPETENT AUTHORITY QUOTA:

- a. 85 % Seats available (after contributing 15% of seats to All India Quota, Government of India Nominee &BIMSTEC seats) in Government Ayurveda, Homoeopathy and Unani Medical Colleges in the State of Andhra Pradesh, affiliated to Dr. NTRUHS.
- b. 50% of seats in Private Un-aided Non-Minority (BAMS&BHMS) Colleges in the State of Andhra Pradesh, affiliated to Dr. NTR UHS.
- c. As per the Ministry of AYUSH/NCISM/NCH/Government of India/Dr. NTR UHS Rules, the admissions into these courses will be made through common counseling for Competent Authority Quota.
- d. The total number of seats in the affiliated colleges for the academic year 2025-26 as per Annexure-I

2. ELIGIBILITY: -

a) THE CANDIDATES WHO SECURED THE CUT OFF MARKS AND MORE IN THE NEET UG - 2025 CONDUCTED BY NATIONAL TESTING AGENCY AND FULFILL THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ADMISSION INTO **BAMS, BHMS & BUMS** COURSES. THEY HAVE TO SUBMIT THEIR ONLINE APPLICATION BY PAYING THE NON-REFUNDABLE APPLICATION AND PROCESSING FEE THROUGH ONLINE AND UPLOAD THE SCANED CERTIFICATES/DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR **COMPETENT AUTHORITY QUOTA SEATS.**

Minimum cutoff score in NEET UG - 2025.

Category	Qualifying Criteria	Cut off score (out of 720)
General category (incl. EWS category)	50 th Percentile	686-144
Persons with Disability of OC/EWS	45 th Percentile	143-127

b) The candidates who got registered as Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) / Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) Card holders on or after 04.03.2021 are eligible for admission only against any Non-Resident Indian seat or any supernumerary seat; and shall not be eligible for admission against any seat reserved exclusively for Indian Citizens.

2.1 Minimum Age and other conditions: -

- a) Candidates should have completed the age of 17 years as on 31st December, 2025.
- b) Candidates who do not complete 17 years as on 31.12.2025 are not eligible.
- c) Age shall be calculated on the basis of date of birth as Indicated in the Board of Secondary School Certificate Examination (SSC) or Equivalent Examination.
- d) There is No upper age limit.
- e) English is compulsory subject.
- f) Students shall be admitted once in a year.
- g) Students shall be medically fit.

2.2 EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION:

Passing marks for eligibility in admission to ASU&H-UG courses should be as per the ASU&H-UG regulations and should be followed strictly. The details of qualifications for different categories are as follows:

- **a)** For Ayurveda -BAMS:- The candidates shall have passed 10+2 or its equivalent with subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Bio-Technology. The candidates securing minimum qualifying percentile in NEET 2025 is compulsory. (Ref No. 1/1/2025-AACCC, dated 01.08.2025 of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine, New Delhi).
- **b)** For Homeopathy BHMS: The candidates shall have passed 10+2 or its equivalent with subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Bio-Technology. The candidates securing minimum qualifying percentile in NEET 2025 is compulsory. (Ref No. 1/1/2025-AACCC, dated 01.08.2025 of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine, New Delhi).

c) For Unani-BUMS: -

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION AS PER REGULATIONS of National Commission of Indian System of Medicine, F.No.11-76/2021-BUMS (Unani- UG-Regln.) dated 28.02.2022.

- a) Admissions to Kamil-E-TIB-Wa-Jarahat course: A candidate seeking admission to main Kamil-E-Tib-Wa-Jarahat (Bachelor of Unani Medicine and Surgery -B.U.M.S.) Course must have passed.
- b) The candidates shall have passed 10+2 or its equivalent with subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Bio-Technology. The candidates must secure minimum qualifying percentile in NEET 2025 is compulsory.
 (Ref No. 1/1/2025-AACCC, dated 01.08.2025 of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine, New Delhi).
- **c)** Candidate shall have passed Urdu or Arabic or Persian language as on the subject in the 10th standard or in 12th standard.
- **d)** Candidate who is not covered under clause (c) shall have to study Urdu language along with Arabic and Mantiq Wa-Falsafa (Logic and Philosophy) as a subject during the First professional B.U.M.S session.
- e) The syllabus is applicable to the students admitted in the academic year session 2021-22 onwards for 5 years or until further notification by NCISM, whichever is earlier (Ref.11-79/2020-Unani (U. G. Syllabus) dt.29.03.2021.

2.3 DURATION OF COURSE: -

The duration of **BAMS**, **BHMS** and **BUMS** Courses course is 5 ½ academic Years including 1 (one)year Compulsory Rotatory Internship.

3. RESERVATION IN FAVOUR OF THE LOCAL CANDIDATES:

3.1 Admission to 85% of the available seats shall be reserved in favour of the Local candidates in relation to the local area as provided in A.P. Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission) order, 1974 as given in Annexure-III of G.O. (P) No. 646, Edu. (W1) Department, dt.10-7-1979 and as per G.O.Ms.Nos.80,81&82 of HM&FW (C1) Dept., dated.22-07-2025.

3.2 LOCAL AREA:

- a. Andhra University Area: The part of the State comprising the erstwhile districts of Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Visakhapatnam, East Godavari, West Godavari, Krishna, Guntur and Prakasam shall be regarded as the Local Area for the purpose of admission to the Andhra Pradesh Government / Un-aided Non-Minority / Minority Professional Institutions i.e., Undergraduate Medical and Dental Professional courses and to any other educational institutions (other than a state-wide university or statewide educational institution) which is subject to the control of the State Government and is situated in that part.
- **b. <u>Sri Venkateswara University Area</u>:** The part of the State comprising the erstwhile districts of Anantapur, Kurnool, Chittoor, Cuddapah and Nellore shall be regarded as the Local Area for the purpose of admission to the Andhra Pradesh Government / Unaided Non-Minority / Minority Professional Institutions i.e Undergraduate Medical and Dental Professional courses and to any other educational institutions (other than a statewide university or state-wide educational institution) which is subject to the control of the State Government and is situated in that part.

3.3 LOCAL CANDIDATES:

1. The Local Candidate means:

- (A) A candidate for admission shall be regarded as a local candidate in relation to a local area.
 - (a) If he/she has studied in educational Institution or educational Institutions in such local area for a period of not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she appeared or as the case may be, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination, or
 - (b) Where, during the whole or any part of the four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he/she has not studied in any educational Institutions, if he/she has resided in that local area for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination in which he/she appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared.

- (B) A candidate for admission to the Course who is not regarded as local candidate under clause (A) in relation to any local area shall,-
 - (a) If he/she has studied in educational Institutions in the State for a period of not less than seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination be regarded as a local candidate in relation to, -
 - (i) Such local area where he/she has studied for the maximum period out of said period of seven years, or
 - (ii) Where the period of his/her study in two local areas are equal, such local area, where he/she has studied last in such equal period, or
 - (b) If, during the whole or any part of seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he/she has not studied in the educational Institutions in any local area, but has resided in the State during the whole of the said period of seven years, be regarded as a local candidate in relation to, -
 - (i) Such local area where he/she has resided for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years, or
 - (ii) Where the periods of his/her residence in two local areas are equal, such local area where he/she has resided last in such equal periods.
- (C) Local Status Certificate issued through online mode by MRO for claiming as Andhra Pradesh local as per G.o.Ms.No.132 & 133, GA (SPF&MC) Department, dt.13,6.2016 and circular Memo.No.4136/SPF&MC/2015-5, Dated: 08-08-2016 & Memo.No.4136/SPF&MC/2015-9 dated 03-09- 2016 and its amendments issued by the General Administration Dept., Govt of Andhra Pradesh.

2. The following categories of candidates are eligible to apply for admission under 15% of the available ANDHRA PRADESH UNRESERVED Seats.

- i. All the candidates eligible to be declared as local candidates of two local areas of State of Andhra Pradesh.
- ii. Candidates who have resided in the State of Andhra Pradesh for a total period of 10 years excluding periods of study outside the State or either of whose parents have resided in the State of Andhra Pradesh for a total period of ten years excluding period of employment outside the State.
- iii. Candidates who are children of parents who are in employment of the State of Andhra Pradesh or Central Government, Public Sector Corporations, Local Bodies, Universities and Educational Institutions other similar quasi-Public Institutions within the State of Andhra Pradesh.
- iv. Candidates who are spouses of those in the employment of the State of Andhra Pradesh or Central Government, public sector corporations, Local Bodies, Universities and Educational Institutions recognized by the Government or University or other Competent Authority and similar quasi–Government Institutions within the State of Andhra Pradesh."
- N.B.: The Scanned copies of relevant certificates must be uploaded for verification along with online application. In respect of residence certificate, the certificate should be obtained from the Revenue authorities clearly specifying the years.

(4). RESERVATIONS:

A. Reservation for Scheduled Castes (S.C.) and Scheduled Tribes (S.T.):

i) Out of the seats available for admission under Competent Authority Quota, the following percentage of seats shall be reserved for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Schedule Tribes in each local area.

- ii) In the event that if any seats reserved for S.T. not being filled up, they will be open to the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and vice-versa.
- iii) In the event of the candidates from the SC and ST are not being available, these seats shall be allotted to the candidates under open competition.
- iv) Candidates of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes belonging to the State of Andhra Pradesh only which are specified by the Govt. of A.P. from time to time shall be considered.

B. RESERVATION FOR BACKWARD CLASSES (B.C):

i) 29% of the available seats for admission in each local area Under Dr. NTR UHS for UG AYUSH (BAMS, BHMS & BUMS) courses shall be reserved for candidates belonging to Backward Classes as follows: -

- ii) As per the G.O.Ms.No.1793, Education, dt.23.09.1970 and G.O.Ms.No.23, Backward Classes Welfare (C2) Dept., dated. 07-07-2007 & G.O.Ms.No.231, Health, Medical and Family Welfare (E1) Dept, dated. 11-07-2009.
- iii) If qualified candidates belonging to Back Ward Class of particular group are not available, the leftover seats can be adjusted for the candidates of next group. If qualified candidates belonging to Back Ward Classes are not available to fill up the 29% seats reserved for them, the leftover seats shall be treated as Open Competition seats and shall be filled up with candidates by merit.

^{*}Reservation under BC-E is subject to further orders from Government of A.P./High Court.

C. RESERVATION FOR ECONOMICALLY WEAKER SECTIONS (EWS):

The reservation of 10% in favour of Economically Weaker Section (EWS) candidates who are not covered under existing scheme of reservation for SC/ST & BCs will be made as per the procedure/ guidelines issued by the Government of AP in the Government Ayurveda & Homeo. Medical Colleges where additional seats are permitted by AYUSH/ Govt. of India for the purpose.

The persons seeking the benefit of reservation under EWS category shall obtain the Income & Asset Certificate for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) valid for the year 2025-26 issued by the Tahsildar on or after 01.04.2025.

NOTE: Keeping in view of exhaust of 10 years common admission process by 01-06-2024 as per State Reorganization Act, 2014, the EWS certificates issued by Govt. of A.P will only be considered for admissions.

D. <u>RESERVATION FOR WOMEN CANDIDATES:</u> 33 1/3% of seats are reserved for women candidates which are horizontal reservation.

5. SOCIAL STATUS CERTIFICATE:

The candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes shall furnish a certificate in the prescribed proforma in support of their claims. The social status of Schedule Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes candidates shall be Scrutinized in terms of G.O.M.s.No.58, SW (J) Dept. Dt. 12-05-1997.

The candidates are informed that they will not be considered for the caste claimed by them unless they upload the latest **Integrated Community Certificate**, prescribed by the Government and issued by the Revenue Authorities (Vide G.O.Ms.No.58, Social Welfare (J) Department, dated. 12-05-1997) with barcode **(Annexure - II)**.

6. RESERVATIONS UNDER THE SPECIAL CATEGORIES:

6.1 Seats shall be reserved in each course and in each category for the following to the extent indicated against them:

6.2 RESERVATIONS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (PwD): -

- 1. 5% of seats in each category (Horizontal Reservation) shall be reserved for Person with Benchmark Disability as per the G.O. Ms. No.80, HM & FW (C1), dated 28.06.2018.
- 2. In respect of persons with disability candidate specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said qualifying examination are as follows: a) In Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be 45% in the case of General Category. b) 40% in the case of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes. (for PWD candidates only).

- 3. The Guidelines issued by Central Government and notified by the NCISM/NCH, (available on counseling website namely www.aaccc.gov.in under) shall be observed in making admissions of Persons with Disabilities (PwD) candidates. The Medical Board constituted by the Competent Authority will examine and assess the percentage of disability of differently abled candidates, who have applied for admission under PH Quota. Such candidates have to appear before the Medical Board, to be constituted by the Competent Authority and notified by the University for Eligibility under PwD status along with a valid disability certificate issued not later than three months prior to submitting his /her application. The report of the Medical Board is final for considering a candidate under PH Quota as per rules.
- **6.3** The reservation for Special categories mentioned above shall be provided on the basis of compartmentalized horizontal reservation for each category of OC, BC, SC and ST's as per the G.O.Ms.No.131, Health Medical and Family Welfare (R.2) Department, dated 25.04.2008.

NOTE:

- a) The reservation of seats under above special category are subject to the availability of seats in each category as the number of available seats in the **BAMS**, **BHMS** & **BUMS COURSES** are very less.
- b) The Reservation for Special categories mentioned above shall be provided on the basis of compartmentalized horizontal reservation for each category of OC, BC, SC and ST's.
- c) The Reservations and priorities in respect of the above categories will be as per the Government orders and subsequent amendments issued from time to time in the respective categories.
- d) The guidelines of Govt. of India and Regulations of Ministry of AYUSH/NCISM/NCH shall be observed in making admissions of persons with disabilities (PwD) candidates.
- e) The Medical Board constituted by the Competent Authority will examine and assess the percentage of disability of differently abled candidates, who have applied for admission under PwD Category. Such candidates have to upload the following documents and also to appear before the Medical Board constituted by the Competent Authority and as notified by the University for Eligibility under PwD status along with following documents.
 - a. A valid UDID card issued by a designated medical authority under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE).
 - b. Self-Certified affidavits in the format provided under Schedule -I

- c. In addition to the above, a copy of Medical Assessment Report -2025 issued by Medical Board of Counselling Committee is also required to be uploaded.
- d. The report of the Medical Board is final for considering a candidate under PwD Category as per rules.
- The genuineness of the Original Certificates of the candidates claiming reservation under Special Category i.e. CAP & NCC will be scrutinized and confirmed by the officials of the concerned Departments after Certificates Verification. The Merit list / Priority wise list submitted by the Concerned Authorities after Scrutiny and Confirmation is final, basing on which the selections into UG AYUSH Courses under the Special Categories will be made by the University.

g) NCC - G.O.Ms.No.44, Higher Education (RM) Dept., dated 16-07-2025.

The Govt. of Andhra Pradesh issued the following guidelines for awarding grace marks to NCC cadets who have obtained NCC Certificates prior to qualifying exam ie., Intermediate or its equivalent in respective common entrance tests for admission into various courses as follows:

a) The grace marks shall be awarded to NCC cadets in the respective common entrance test for admission into MBBS/BDS/Ayush courses as follows:-

S.No	Category	Grace marks to be allotted as a percentage of the marks secured by the candidate
1	Participation in RDC	7%
2	Participation in TSC/VSC/NSC	5%
3	NCC 'B' Certificate	3%
4	NCC 'A' Certificate	1%

- b) Grace marks shall be awarded to only those candidates who have qualified/secured cut-off marks in the respective common entrance test.
- c) Total grace marks awarded shall be done in a cumulative manner upto the upper limit 15% of the marks secured by the candidate in the respective common entrance test as explained below:

S1. No	Category of certificates obtained by a NCC cadet	Grace marks to be allotted as a percentage of the marks secured
1	Only A certificate	1%
2	A certificate and B certificate	3% (the higher certificate in considered)
3	A certificate, B certificate and participation in TSC / VSC / NSC	3%+5%=8%
4	A certificate, B certificate, participation in TSC / VSC / NSC and participation RDC	3%+5%+7%=15%

d) Grace marks shall be added to the marks secured by the candidate in the respective common entrance test and admissions shall be made accordingly.

- e) In case of a tie between two or more candidates, the candidate who has secured higher marks in the respective common entrance test shall get priority over others.
- f) Admission of NCC cadets shall be limited to a maximum of 1% of total seats duly following the method of Horizontal reservation.
- g) Any NCC cadet can avail the above incentive of grace marks only once in a lifetime. In other words, a NCC Cadet can secure admission into above courses based on grace marks only once in his/her lifetime.
- h) NCC cadets who seek admission under NCC category shall produce the authenticated certificates obtained from the NCC Directorate as required by the competent authority for admission.
- i) On request from such competent authority, the NCC Directorate, Andhra Pradesh shall be responsible for verifying and certifying the genuineness of the certificates and also indicating the percentage of grace marks to be awarded to the particular candidates.
- j) Only NCC certificates issued by NCC Directorate shall be valid.
- k) After adding the grace marks, the total marks of the candidate shall be limited to the maximum marks of the respective common entrance test (CET).

7. APPLICATIONS THROUGH ONLINE:

- 7.1 The on-line application form for determining merit position for Competent Authority Quota seats using NEET UG-2025 scores will be available on the website https://drntr.uhsap.in from 03.00 PM on 08.09.2025 to 09.00 PM on 16.09.2025.
- <u>Note:</u> The candidates are advised to take a print out of the Prospectus/Instructions from the Website https://drntr.uhsap.in and verify the Eligibility under Local/ Non-local category for Competent Authority Quota Seats before proceeding to fill the application form.
- **7.2** The candidate should fill the online application form available in the Website with the data required-for and upload the scanned Certificates/Documents in support of their claim through internet. The online application form can be filled through any computer with internet connection (home/internet cafe/net center).
 - The candidate is advised to fill the online application form after going through the Prospectus by keeping all the Certificates ready to enter the correct data and uploading of the scanned copies of certificates/documents, photo and signature after payment of fee through online.

8. Fee Particulars:

8.1. Procedure of submission of online application: Payment of registration fee by any Indian Credit card/Debit Card/Net Banking/UPI.



- 15.4 There shall not be any offline admission or admission without counselling (Central/State/UT) and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.
- **15.5** NCISM/NCH shall not approve admissions made without the original documents of the Candidates.
- **15.6** Admission made in violation of the NCISM / NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under the NCISM Act, 2020 / NCH Act, 2020.
- 15.7 Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities such as offline admissions, admission without counseling, and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity. In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be subjected to face consequences as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of NCISM Act 2020/NCH Act 2020, and the person responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC/BNS concerned. whichever is applicable.
- **15.8** Admissions shall not be approved by any means after the cut-off date and time for admission as specified by NCISM/NCH.
- **15.9** No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCISM/NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved.
- **15.10** No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission into UG courses In ASU&H colleges sanctioned by MARBISM/NCISM/MARBH/NCH.
- **15.11**The colleges/institutes shall ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective NCISM (MSE-UG) Regulations 2022 for Ayurveda, and Unani admissions and NCH (Homoeopathy Graduate Degree Course Bachelor of Homeopathic Medicine and Surgery (B.H.M.S). Regulations- 2022 for admissions in Homeopathy-UG courses by proper scrutiny of the relevant original certificates and documents at the time of admission.
- **15.12** AACCC, M/o Ayush will circulate the list of ineligible candidates to the State/UT Counseling Authority during the 3 & Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) of AACCC-UG counseling to prevent them from participating in the State counseling. Such candidates shall not be allotted any seat through any rounds of State counseling for admission in the said courses.

The objective is to ensure that the Appendix aligns with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, and the Notification of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment dated 12March2024 concerning updated disability assessment standards.

- 2. After thorough consultations, the Interim Guidelines outlining the assessment method for admitting PwBD candidates to the MBBS course have been framed and are made implementable for the admissions in academic year 2025-26.
- 3. As per the Interim Guidelines, the following is the procedure for admission in MBBS Course in Academic Year 2025-26:
 - PwBD candidates must submit:
 - A valid UDID card issued by a designated medical authority under Ministry of Social Justice (MoSJE).
 - Self-Certified Affidavits in the format provided under Schedule -I.
 - The candidate will have to report to the designated medical board (16 designated medical boards) for verification of their self-certified affidavit.
- 4. The Designated Medical Boards are responsible for

verifying candidate's self-certified affidavits and evaluating their functional abilities. Detailed assessment procedures for these boards are set forth in the Interim Guidelines.

INTERIM GUIDELINES ON ASSESSMENT METHOD FOR GRANTING ADMISSION IN MBBS COURSE TO PWBD CANDIDATES FOR AY 2025–26

PREAMBLE:

In pursuit of equitable and inclusive medical education, the National Medical Commission (NMC) remains steadfast in its commitment to ensuring fair access to medical courses for all eligible candidates, including Persons with Disabilities (PwD). In alignment with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, and the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, this interim report outlines the foundational framework and preparatory measures for facilitating the admission of PwBD candidates in MBBS Course.

This report serves as a step towards strengthening existing mechanisms, identifying challenges, and proposing recommendations for creating an enabling environment that upholds the principles of dignity, non-discrimination, and equal opportunity. It focuses on key aspects such as assessment of disability, eligibility criteria, reasonable accommodations, accessibility standards, and institutional readiness.

The NMC acknowledges the valuable contribution of a diverse medical workforce and envisions a system where every aspiring student, irrespective of physical or cognitive ability, is empowered to pursue a career in medicine and serve society with competence and compassion.

1. Introduction

In alignment with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016, and subsequent notifications, particularly the directive issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE) on 12.03.2024, which underscores the principles of inclusive education and reasonable accommodation, and the landmark judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 25.10.2024 in Om Rathod vs Union of India & Others (SLP (C) No. 21942 of 2024), a significant shift has been initiated in the national approach toward disability inclusion in higher education.

2. Functional Competency Approach

These legal and policy developments collectively emphasize the prioritization of functional competency over rigid percentage-based disability thresholds. In response, the National Medical Commission (NMC) has undertaken proactive measures to ease challenges faced by PwBD candidates, ensuring a fair and inclusive medical education environment. This includes facilitating reasonable accommodations, revisiting eligibility norms, and adopting evaluation criteria focused on individual capabilities.

1

3. Deliberations and Guideline Development

Extensive deliberations were held in various meetings of the NMC, engaging a committee of medical experts. A consensus emerged to develop a **comprehensive guideline** focused on functional ability and reasonable accommodation to enable the fair inclusion of PwBD candidates in the **MBBS program**, without subjecting them to undue hardship or exclusion.

This initiative is aimed at reinforcing existing systems, identifying practical challenges, and formulating evidence-based recommendations to build an enabling environment grounded in the principles of dignity, non-discrimination, and equal opportunity. It will focus on critical areas including disability assessment, eligibility criteria, and provision of reasonable accommodations, accessibility standards, and institutional preparedness

4. Interim Admission Approach for AY 2025-26

Defining essential competencies for each type of disability involves a very complex process which is multi-dimensional & dynamic. Assistive devices & medical technologies are also rapidly advancing & evolving. Striking a balance between inclusion and the imperatives of patient safety and clinical competence in medical education and practice is of paramount importance.

Pertinent to mention that Post Graduate medical courses shall require specialty specific deliberations, as the required competencies and skills may vary over a wider range and therefore additional consultations with medical experts/ beneficiaries/ stakeholders are needed.

In view of aforesaid facts, final guidelines after following all procedural aspects and further consultations, shall be notified & implemented from subsequent Academic Years. However, the admission process for PwBD candidates for AY 2025–26 must continue uninterrupted. Accordingly, the group of medical experts under the committee duly constituted by NMC (under the chairmanship of Dr. Achal Gulati), have unanimously reached to a conclusion to adopt interim guidelines for admissions in AY 2025–26.

5. Functional Assessment of Disabilities

The previously mandated arithmetic **threshold** shall be no longer applicable. Instead, emphasis will be placed on assessing a candidate's **functional ability** to meet the academic and clinical demands of the MBBS course.

6. Mandatory Use of UDID Portal

As per Gazette Notification S.O. 1736(E) dated 05.05.2021, issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPwD), all disability certificates and UDID cards must be issued via the UDID online portal, effective June 1, 2021.

Accordingly, the UDID card has been established as a mandatory document for persons with disabilities. In this context, it may be regarded as an essential and authoritative proof for evaluating the eligibility of meritorious NEET UG candidates under the disability category..

7. Evaluation Framework Based on MoSJE Guidelines

Further in view of the paramount importance of patient safety and clinical competence, the assessment of candidates with disabilities may be conducted in accordance with the recently notified guidelines dated 12.03.2024 issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE). These guidelines provide a structured and uniform framework to ensure that the evaluation of disability is both comprehensive and consistent with the responsibilities inherent to medical practice.

8. Institutional Responsibilities under the RPwD Act

The medical colleges as per the recommendations prescribed under RPwD Act, 2016, shall make maximum efforts in accommodating and facilitating the candidates with disabilities:

Non-Discrimination in Admission and Education (Section 16):

Institutions must ensure that no student with a disability is denied admission on the grounds of disability and must provide an inclusive education system at all levels.

Infrastructure Accessibility (Section 45):

Institutions must ensure barrier-free access to buildings, classrooms, libraries, laboratories, hostels, and other facilities as per the standards notified by the Government of India.

Sensitization and Capacity Building:

Colleges are encouraged to conduct awareness and sensitization programs for faculty, staff, and students to promote an inclusive environment and reduce attitudinal barriers.

Nodal Officer for Disability Affairs:

Institutions are advised to appoint a dedicated Nodal Officer or establish a Disability Cell to address the concerns and support needs of students with disabilities.



Grievance Redressal Mechanism:

An accessible and responsive grievance redressal system must be in place to address complaints related to discrimination or lack of accommodation.

9. Decision Taken

The expert panel unanimously agreed on the following for MBBS admissions under the PwBD category for AY 2025-26:

- · PwBD candidates must submit:
 - A valid UDID card issued by a designated medical authority under MoSJE.
 - Self-Certified affidavits in the format provided under Schedule -I.
 - The candidate will have to approach the designated medical board for verification of their self-certified affidavit.
- Designated Medical Boards (16 designated medical boards) are required to undertake following duties:
 - The competencies mentioned in the appendix under Schedule-I are basic & mandatory. The candidates, to the satisfaction of the designated medical board, may demonstrate the competencies that have been declared by him/her. If the board finds the declared competencies unsubstantiated based on the candidate's performance, it must issue a reasoned decision declaring him/her ineligible to pursue medical course.
 - o If the candidate while self-declaring the essential competencies mentions one or more competencies in negative or is not able to demonstrate one or more of the listed essential competencies, the board shall see if he/she is able to compensate such deficits, by other alternative functionalities; and may take a holistic view regarding his capability to pursue MBBS course.
 - The designated medical boards may utilize standardized tests and tools to evaluate the abilities of the candidates, as per their declaration, instead of focusing on the disabilities.
 - All decisions of the designated medical board(s) shall be in the form speaking orders.

Admissions will be processed by the **counseling authority**, based on **NEET 2025 scores**, institutional preferences, and verification of required documents by the concerned designated medical board(s). Medical colleges will provide accommodations accordingly.
